

Resident and Family Council Meeting January 08, 2019 1400 hrs

- 2.0. Old Business.

- 3.0. Resident and Family Council Fund Balance: \$403.13 as of Dec. 31, 2018. No fundraising plans at this time. No new items for Wish List.
